

- 1) What can be burned in the City Limits of Claremore?
 - a. **Yard brush.** Yard brush may be burned on the property where the waste is generated or transported. If transported, yard brush must be burned in accordance with Oklahoma Administrative Code 252:100-13-8 and OAC 252:100-13-8.1. "Yard brush" means cut or broken branches, leaves, limbs, shrubbery, or tree trimmings. It does not include refuse, grass clippings, in-ground tree stumps, or any non-vegetative material.
 - b. **Wood waste or clean lumber.** Wood waste, clean lumber, or a mixture of only wood waste and clean lumber may be burned in accordance with Oklahoma Administrative Code 252:100-13-8 and 252:100-13-8.1. Wood waste is defined as untreated wood and untreated wood products, including tree stumps (whole or chipped), trees, tree limbs (whole or chipped), bark, sawdust, chips, scraps, slabs, millings, and shavings.
 - c. What is Oklahoma Administrative Code 252:100-13-8 and 252:100-13-8.1 and where can I find this information? **This is information provided by DEQ and can be found at the following address in subchapter 13.** <https://www.deq.ok.gov/wp-content/uploads/deqmainresources/100.pdf>
 - d. **NOTE Any fire burned inside of the city limits of Claremore in which an air curtain incinerator is used would require the issuance of a burn permit from the City of Claremore Fire Marshal's Office.**
- 2) What cannot be burned?
 - a. **Wood products that have been painted, pigment-stained, pressure-treated, any lumber containing creosote, or manufactured wood products that contain adhesives or resins (e.g., plywood, particle board, flake board, and oriented strand board).**
 - b. **BURNING OR INCINERATION OF SOLID WASTE PROHIBITED.** The disposal by burning or incineration of solid waste by any individual, householder, or establishment in any place, private or public, within the city limits, is prohibited and shall be an offense punishable by fine. **SOLID WASTE** is defined as Garbage, trash, rubbish, and other refuse.
 - c. **Construction, renovation, or demolition wastes.**
- 3) I have built or bought a fire pit do I need a burn permit?
 - a. **If you have purchased a UL listed fire pit, chiminea, or constructed a masonry/non-combustible fire pit a burn permit will no longer be required.**
 - b. **Constructed masonry/ non-combustible fire pits must be smaller than a 3' x3' area to not require a burn permit.**
 - c. **All UL Listed devices must be used according to manufactures recommendation.**
- 4) When do I need a burn permit?
 - a. **A burn permit will be required for any open burning done OUTSIDE of a UL listed fire pit, chiminea, or a constructed masonry/non-combustible fire pit in a residential area.**
 - b. **Any size brush that is out in the open will require a burn permit, brush piles will be required to be minimized to a 3'x3' area. They will require constant monitoring and must be put out completely before dark.**
 - c. **A burn permit will also be required for every commercial property and/or for any land clearing operation wanting to burn.**
- 5) If I have questions whether a burn permit is required who do I contact?
